Reading buddies program

Inspiring new and current patrons:

- Offered several new programs for children: stop-motion animation workshops, Codemobile workshops to teach coding, and weekly reading buddies program for teen volunteers to help younger student practice their reading
- Began loaning radon detection kits and the bat pack, a community and educator bat resource


