We listened, we learned, and we responded.

- After School Kids (ASK!) launched and filled weekly with crafts, games, and reading.
- Sensory Kits introduced to support patrons with sensory needs.
- New books added for Diwali, Hanukkah, Lunar New Year, and multilingual collections in Spanish and French.
- Storytimes, daycare visits, and take-home kits kept families engaged year-round.

Popular programs included Bear Talks, Eagle Awareness, Home Buying 101, and Community Book Club.

We upgraded, digitized, and connected.

- Reintroduced 1-on-1 Tech Coaching to help build skills and confidence with navigating technology.
- Launched a new online digital repository that houses the Squamish History Archives and includes over 5,000 records.
- Launched room booking and event registration software to streamline use of library space.
- Digitized *The Squamish Chief* newspaper archives up to 2010 for public access.
- Expanded the Library of Things with GoPro, bike stand, dog agility course, projector & screen, and more.
